

**Dr Nihal Jayawickrama** is the Coordinator of the UN-sponsored Judicial Integrity Group – a representative group of Chief Justices – that drafted the *Bangalore Principles of Judicial Conduct*, the 175-page *Commentary on the Bangalore Principles*, and the *Measures for the Effective Implementation of the Bangalore Principles*.

A graduate of the University of Ceylon, he received his doctorate from the University of London, School of Oriental and African Studies, for his research on the international law of human rights. He practised law in Sri Lanka before serving briefly as Attorney General and then, for seven years, as Permanent Secretary to the Ministry of Justice. In the latter capacity, he was responsible for introducing the most extensive reform of the judicial system and criminal, civil and appellate procedures in nearly a century. He was a member of the Judicial Services Advisory Board responsible for the appointment and transfer of judges; the Council of Legal Education; the New Delhi-based Asian-African Legal Consultative Committee; and of the Permanent Court of Arbitration at The Hague. He was the Representative to the Third Committee of the United Nations General Assembly, and a member of the Committee that drafted the Constitution of the Republic of Sri Lanka.

Moving into academic life, he was a Research Fellow at King's College, University of London; Associate Professor of Law at the University of Hong Kong; and the Ariel F. Sallows Professor of Human Rights at the University of Saskatchewan, Canada. In Hong Kong, he was Chairman of JUSTICE, the Hong Kong Section of the International Commission of Jurists. He was Executive Director of Transparency International in Berlin; a member of the Advisory Board of the US-based Genetics Policy Institute; and Chair of the Commonwealth Human Rights Initiative in London. Since 2001, he has served on UN expert groups and prepared several UN reports. As an independent consultant to UNDP, UNODC, UNOHCHR and the EU on governance, judicial reform and the implementation of UNCAC, he has worked with governments and judiciaries in Asia and the Pacific, Africa, and Eastern and Central Europe.

He is the author of *The Judicial Application of Human Rights Law* (Cambridge University Press, 2002, 2<sup>nd</sup> ed. 2017, 1200 pp.).

### **The Hon John Dowd AO QC**

Graduating in Law from Sydney University, John Dowd was admitted as a solicitor, then became a partner of a Sydney city firm before being called to the Bar in 1967, practising then in New South Wales, the ACT, and Papua New Guinea. In 1991 he became a member of the Kings Inns in Dublin and was admitted to the Bar of Ireland. He was appointed Queens Counsel in NSW, in 1990 and the ACT, 1992.

In 1975 John Dowd was elected member for Lane Cove in the NSW Parliament, elected Leader of the Opposition 1981 to 1983, and on the Liberal National Party forming government in 1988, was appointed Attorney-General and Leader of the House, until his parliamentary retirement in June 1991.

As Attorney-General he instituted reforms of the Supreme, District and Local Courts, enhancing the courts' efficiency and carried out extensive reforms of criminal, tort and motor accident law. He was one of those instrumental in the establishment of Australia's first Independent Commission Against Corruption in 1988, as well as creating the Office of State Coroner.

John Dowd was appointed to the Common Law Division of the Supreme Court of NSW in 1994, retiring in 2004. His judicial service included sitting on the Court of Criminal Appeal.

In 1973 John Dowd joined the International Commission of Jurists Australia (ICJA) subsequently being elected President. In 1999 he was appointed an International Commissioner of the ICJ, and elected Chairperson of the ICJ Executive Committee in Geneva, 2002-2009. He was elected Vice-President of the international ICJ in 2008 until 2013. He carried out missions including to the Philippines in 1977, to Hong Kong in 1991, East Timor in 2000, Nepal in 2003 and several times to Indonesia.

In 1996 John Dowd led the Australian Government delegation to Palestine to monitor the Palestinian Legislative Council Elections, and assisted in establishing the procedures for the Palestinian Legislative Council.

Between 1992-1994 John Dowd was Consul-General for the Cook Islands to Australia.

In 1992 John Dowd was elected as a Director of the Spastic Centre later Deputy President, retiring from that office in 1999. He was then appointed inaugural Goodwill Ambassador for the Spastic Centre, now the Cerebral Palsy Alliance.

John Dowd was for its lifetime a Director of the since replaced Alola Foundation, an organisation working to address the needs of East Timorese women in areas of advocacy, economic empowerment, education and literacy, maternal and child health and humanitarian assistance.

In 2002 John Dowd was elected Chancellor of Southern Cross University, a regional University in New South Wales with campuses at Lismore, Coffs Harbour, Sydney and the Gold Coast, retiring in September 2014. Some one third of the university's students learn through distance education, primarily from Asia. On retirement John Dowd was awarded an Honorary Doctorate of Laws from Southern Cross University

In 2005 John Dowd was appointed Protection Ambassador for Austcare, subsequently a Director, Vice-President in 2008, then President of its successor organisation ActionAid Australia from July 2009 to May 2017.
